#### B. C. HOSPITAL

August 28th, the provincial tag day in aid of the British Columbia Hospital for overseas service, marks the close of an effort to get \$25,000 with which to provide the B. C. Base Hospital No. 5 with the ambulance and surgical equipment necessary for work at the front. The Red Cross Society is sparing no effort to have this amount on hand at the end of next week.

August 28th, it must be remembered, marks the close and not the beginning of the movement. Subscriptions are now in order, and it is earnestly hoped that all will do what they can to provide the British Columbia boys at the front with everything necessary for their welfare in the way of careful; and efficient hospital treatment.

They are doing their duty nobly in the interests of the province, Canada and the Empire, and it is our duty to aid them in every possible way. The 311 volunteer doctors, nurses and orderlies may be ordered to the front at any time, therefore it is essential that a large part of the desired amount should be on hand at the earliest possible moment. Dig down and help the "Life Saving Fifth."


