### DEFEAT AT ITS VERY WORST

"You've lost everything!" said the arrogant and brute-hearted War-Lord, as he smashed his lawless way through the defences of honor and justice to smite the heart of innocence. "You've lost everything!"

"No, not everything!" came back the voice of the sublimist tragedy of modern times. "No not everything! Not my soul."

And as long as history is written it will be told that, in its day of vaunting triumph, when pride made high its brow and haughtiness made stiff its neck, Germany was doomed to everlasting ignomy, and its blasphemous Emperor was damned beyond either repentance or pardon to the gnawings of pitiless remorse. And every added Prussian triumph, in West or East, by land or sea, shall be but another count in the indictment for which there can be no excuse, another bitterness in the cup in which there can be no sweet. Belgium will answer back to Poland, as Armenia answers to Louvian. Forever and forever they will witness to the infamy that will be Germany. And the nethermost hell of Lucifer is in the memory of the heaven that might have been.

And this was the sin by which Germany fell: it was the sin of Cain—the hateful sin of envy; it was the sin of Esau—the gross lust of the flesh; it was the sin of Judas—the black covetousness that made him both betrayer and thief. Germany's defeat was not when its massed battalions were turned back ten miles from Paris. Its real defeat was in the German mind. When the people yielded to the seditions of the great Self, and sang hymns to Will-to-Power, and proclaimed on the housetops and in the closet that Might is the only right, then the battle for greatness was lost, and what was Germany's soul became a mad and guilty passion.

And this is the warning for the Allies—the solemn warning for Britain and Canada. The one irrecoverable reserve, the one ultimate defeat, would be, not any disaster at the Dardanelles or on the east front or before the forts of the Rhine, but the surrender, on the invisible battleground of the mind of the nation, of the ideals of liberty and justice and truth, for which alone Britain had any rights at the war-fronts of Europe. Victory will be theirs who do not lose their soul.

Herein, too, is the call, the direct and personal call, for service in this war. We wrong ourselves, we stultify our appreciation of what this conflict means, when we make appeal to others, to the able-bodied men of war service age, but make no appeal to ourselves. Where the race is not alone to the swift of foot, and the battle not alone to the strong of sinew, the call to service in this campaign for a moral ideal is loudest of all for those who can think clear and see straight and the nerves of whose mind are steady and strong.

For Canadians the battle fronts are not all in Europe. There is a conflict waged where ever men and women meet, in the homes, at the church, on the street. It is waged not with shrapnel and bursting shells and liquid fire. Its struggle is over the self-same issues of individual liberty and social justice and life's commanding ideal that give all there is of glory and worth to the trenches and the fleets. Its deadlier strife is with the principalities of the evil mind and with the powers of a demonized spirit, of which the German Kaiser is but an individual incarnation and Prussia a national type.

It is but hypocrisy to pretend infinite concern for the overthrow of the selfishness and materialism and un-Christian ideal in Germany, and all

tion which is a good one. From the samples they are showing it looks good, and it is a sight almost unbelievable to see the gold sticking out over the samples they brought in. This property is eight miles from salt water and about eighteen miles below Stewart on the Canal.

This is not so bad for a camp supposed to be a dead one, and surely it must mean that Stewart is coming back. Not with a gold boom, not with a wild rush, but steadily and slowly with properties containing good values and capable of profitable development.

Ore exhibits from the Portland Canal have always been to the fore at every place shown, and their exhibit at this year's Fair will not be behind previous ones. They intend sending down an exhibit, which will be hard to beat, and let us hope that it may help to show people in Prince Rupert at the least, that Portland Canal is a camp capable of producing mining wealth. There are miners there who have stayed with the camp. Good prospectors and men who know good ore. There are new comers from the southern mining fields, who also believe that the mineral is there. Development is going on steadily. Properties are being worked, as far as crown granting is concerned, and the people who hold them are waiting. They are waiting until the large operators have overcome their prejudice towards the camp and, mark it well, the Big Missouri will overcome that.

Though the Big Missouri is represented as being on Salmon river, it is only a short ten or twelve miles from the Portland Canal.
