MOPE LIBERAL GAINS

The electors of Prince Edward Island have again returned the Conservatives to power, but not to any great extent. In 1912, the Conservatives captured 28 out of 30 seats, only 2 Liberals being returned, so that the returning of 13 Liberals against 17 Conservatives is an important Liberal gain.

The weakness of the late government was its strength in the house. With practically no opposition, members of the government played fast and loose with the funds provided for the province. The Dominion government grant under the agricultural aid bill was spent largely in salaries to instructors whose chief qualifications was party allegiance.
