Colonel Carrick, as assistant Eye  
Witness catching any epigrams  
his editor-in-chief might over-  
look, and Colonel Bennett holding  
his charger, fanning away the  
flies or otherwise justifying his  
proud position in the army.

Well, you know what happened.  
Majorgeneralsirsam's visit fairly  
maddened the Allies. They deter-  
mined to get the thing over so  
that the Minister of Militia would  
not need to visit them again. This  
explains the renewed activity on  
the western front, likewise the  
Russian stand near Riga. A little  
talk from Sir Sam goes a long

way. It's good strong talk, al-  
ways with plenty of personal pro-  
nouns in it, but one could hardly  
call it modest.

Since Majorgeneralsirsam re-  
turned he has been galumphing  
from one military camp to another  
with messages from the front.  
These are all very well in their  
way, but what Canada wants to  
know is his policy in regard to  
Honorary Colonels. Two or three  
years ago George Ham, of the C.  
P. R., said he looked forward to  
the day when the Canadian army  
would consist entirely of colonels.  
Since then George has become a  
colonel himself, an honorary col-  
onel, but highly useful neverthe-  
less because his stories are side-  
splitters. Any enemy encountered  
by Colonel George Ham would  
just naturally laugh itself to  
death. But this is digression.  
The real question is whether the  
policy thus faintly defined by Col-  
onel George Ham is to be carried  
out or whether it will be modified.  
The general belief is that privates  
should have a chance. An army  
of colonels looks like overdoing  
it. Public opinion is swinging  
around to a home guard of hono-  
rary colonels, but no more. Of  
course it can be a national home  
guard with branches in every  
town and city and there will be  
plenty of room for everybody, but  
it should not go any further than  
that. That is to say the honorary  
colonels should not be called on  
for active service abroad. A home  
guard is not a home guard when  
it goes gadding about in foreign  
countries. A home guard that  
won't stay at home is no place  
for an honorary colonel.—H. F. G.
