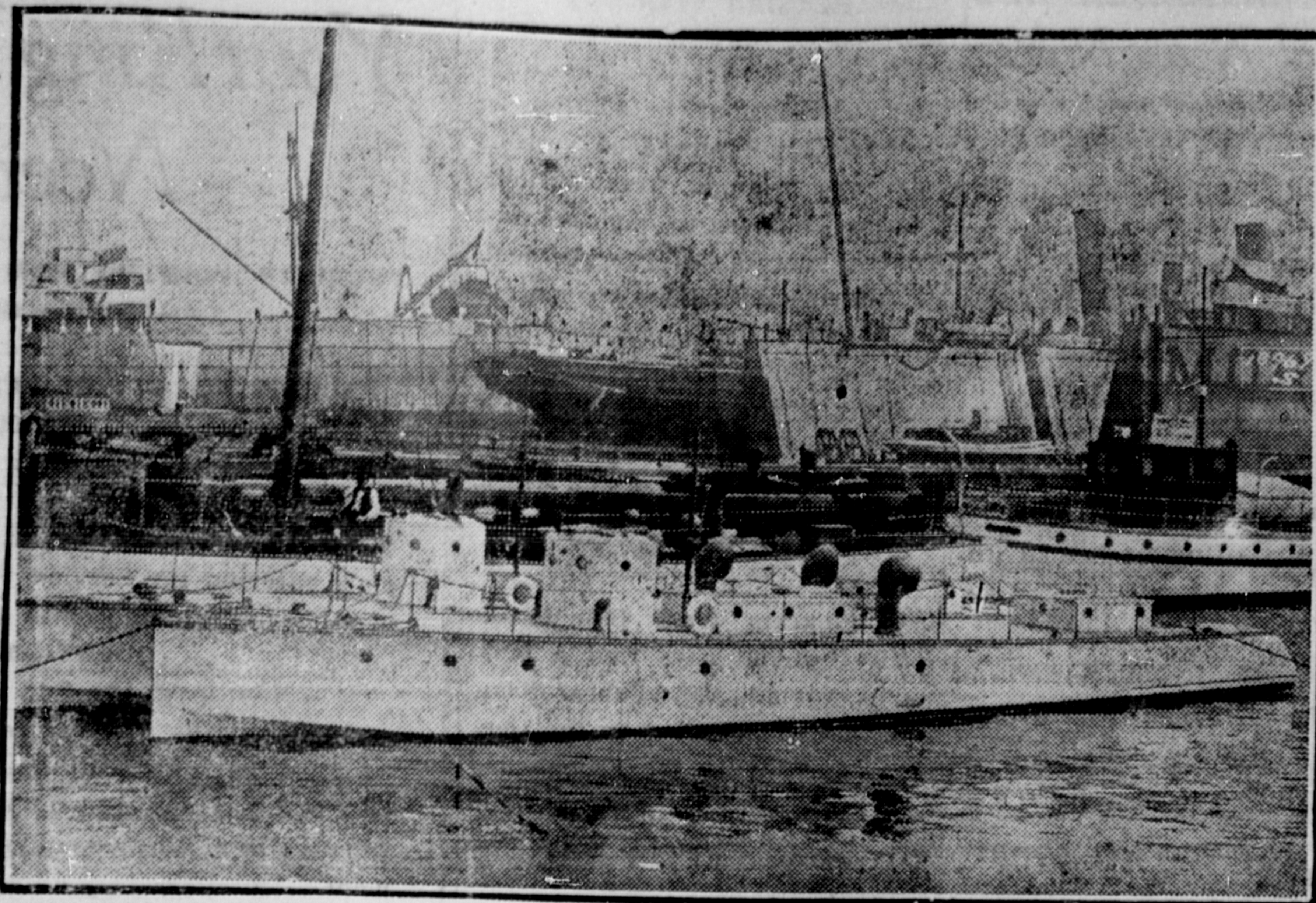

### SPECIAL TRADES AND LABOR COUNCIL MEETING

(Continued From Page One.)

ing from the front; the framing of a Mothers' Pension Act; an act for the prosecution of all employers who publish misleading "help wanted" advertisements; and that Oriental labor in the mines on Vancouver Island be replaced by white labor, and an investigation into the legality of licenses held by Orientals be made.

In speaking of this resolution, Secretary W. E. Thompson pointed out that delegate Foster, from Vancouver Island, scored the minister of labor in regard to the

handling of the strike on the Island. Mr. Crowther quibbled over the question and ultimately refused to answer any further questions on the subject. Mr. Thompson described the minister as a "slippery politician" and a man who did not understand the first principles of organized labor.

The resolution brought in by the Prince Rupert Trades and Labor Council urging that the Labor Congress take steps to form a Labor Party of Canada was not concurred in, as it was outside of the scope of the work of the congress. Another Prince Rupert resolution, asking for an investigation into the sanitary conditions obtaining in salmon canneries, was approved.

The resolution which called forth the most discussion was that dealing with labor's support of the war. A minority held to the opinion that it was entirely outside of the scope of organized labor to incite one man to go to war against another, but the majority approved of the finding of the executive to the effect that "it is the duty of the labor world, and particularly that of the Dominion of Canada and the Empire to lend every possible assistance to the Allies to secure victory for the cause of freedom and democracy."

Votes of thanks to the delegates who attended the congress brought a most interesting meeting to a close.
