

B. SMITH has a dry goods store in a certain Canadian city. He does a good business, but wants

to do more. He believes that Advertising in his local newspaper is the way to get more business. So he advertises—every now and then. This is where our friend Smith is wrong-in advertising every now and

then. He should advertise regularly—as frequently as his local newspaper

In this way Smith can be sure of having his advertisements prepared regularly and intelligently, with no more trouble to him than the supplying of the information required by the writer of the advertisements.

So Smith can do more business, and more business means a larger income for himself, to say nothing of other gains that go hand in hand with the doing of bigger business.

This man Smith---do you know him? Are YOU Smith?
