**TWISTED AGAIN**

The Journal is getting beautifully tangled up in its attempts to accuse Parker Williams of playing party politics, when he stated the truth regarding the McBride government at his recent meeting. The Conservative organ has now got Parker Williams performing acrobatic feats which would tax even the agility of the Journal. In the latest effort, Parker Williams is "trying to follow the Liberal party," and, at the same time, the Liberal party "is hanging on to his coat."

It is a case of any port in a storm. Whatever looks the least like shelter looks good to the Conservatives these days. However, it is interesting to note that the only part of Parker Williams' speech which they attempted to call in question is that in which he said that the Conservative party will be swept from the province. That was the part that hurt. His long and accurate statement of graft and looting has gone unchallenged and his condemnation of William Manson is still awaiting a reply.

**WHAT IS CANADA'S DUTY?**

Shortly after the war began, when subscriptions were first solicited for the patriotic fund, the Reeve of a township in this province, a well-to-do man, was reported as having announced at the township council that the war had already cost him ten dollars, and that if it lasted long it might cost him even more. In view of recent statements in the British Parliament, it would be interesting to know how many people of means in Canada have the Reeve's standard, and hope to save the Empire with a ten dollar bill.

Mr. Montagu, financial secretary of the treasury, has been telling the people of Great Britain that the man who does not study the idea of having half his

income available for the use of the State is not doing his duty. Britain, he said, had to keep up an impregnable navy, and an army which ran into millions. She had advanced to her allies a sum which it was estimated would equip and maintain in the field 3,000,000 of their soldiers. Then Mr. Montagu added: "We are financing by loans to our great Dominions part of their expenditure on the contingents which are helping us to fight."

Mr. Montagu was not complaining. He was stating a fact. The result of all these burdens assumed so willingly is that the British people have become involved in an expenditure for war and governmental purposes amounting to not less than two-thirds of the entire estimated annual national income. In face of these official statements Canada should at once arrange to pay as well as fight. A hundred and sixty thousand Canadians have offered their lives to the cause of liberty and civilization. Why should those of us who have not done so, and who, because of age, physical condition, and other valid reasons, cannot take part in the active operations of warfare, not be called upon now—rather than at some remote time in the future—to carry Canada's share of the war expenditure.

The minister of finance has already announced that a domestic loan will be issued shortly to cover a portion of Canada's expenditure for military purposes. Mr. White does well in this, but does he go far enough? Would it not be better by an immediate tax levy to pay some further portion of the war expenditure of the Dominion rather than meet them by the easy method of writing I. O. U.'s to be cashed by the already hard-pressed people of Great Britain?

When Parliament meets the



question of war financing should be faced honestly. At least five million dollars a month of the total monthly expenditure of fifteen million dollars should be obtained in the form of taxation. It might even be worth while calling Parliament together before the New Year so that Canada may be able to send to Britain the cheering message that no more loans for this Dominion need be provided; that Canada will supply not only men in ever-increasing numbers, but the money for their equipment and maintenance. That would be a worth-while Christmas greeting from Ottawa to the Mother of Parliaments.—Toronto Globe.

**HOW AVIATORS LAND DURING THE NIGHT**

One of the greatest problems which confronts the pilot of an aeroplane while making a night flight is that of landing without mishap. Recognizing the value of night flying, the Germans practised it assiduously previous to the war, and devised a very ingenious scheme for assisting pilots to land in aeroplanes in safety in the dark.

A large white light is placed in the centre of the aerodrome, sunk in a pit in the ground and covered with glass-plate of sufficient thickness to withstand the shock should the wheels of the flying machine pass over it. At a distance—
