Sir George Perley, High Commissioner of the Dominion in London, furnished the following statistics regarding casualties in the Canadian contingent to September 30:

Killed in action: Officers, 96; other ranks, 1,557. Died o wounds: Officers, 27; other ranks, 650. Died of disease, etc.: Officers, 6; other ranks, 99. Wound-38; other ranks, 1,246. Missing: Officers, 22; other ranks, 1,014. Total, 11,705.
