To the Editor:—Seeing that a controversy has arisen re serial bonds, please give me information on the following:

I own two lots in Section One, and have been paying to a sinking fund under the 50-year bond system. I now find the taxes almost unbearable. Will the serial bond system increase or diminish my annual payments. If so, at what rate per centum per annum?

### TAXPAYER

(So long as the debt of the city stands at its present figure, and no new work is undertaken, the net increase in taxes on a \$5,000 lot would be 12 cents per annum under the annuity bond system, paying off the indebtedness in 30 years, as against 50 years under the sinking fund.—Editor.)
