lot of 12 cents per annum."

My answer to the question is that there will be a net increase of \$3.02 per annum for a period of 30 years on a lot valued at \$5,000 in section 1 local improvement bylaw levy, or close to 10 per cent per annum, at the end of such time the debt will be paid off.

I am in favor of the serial bond system for several reasons, but at the same time I wish the facts to be known by the ratepayers. There will be some saving on general tax rates, but that will not alter the annual payments on section 1 local improvement bylaw.

(The above answer is true, so far as it goes, but the complete reply is, that the estimated increase in local improvement of \$3.02 is offset by an estimated reduction in general taxes of \$2.90, leaving an estimated net increase in total taxation of 12 cents per annum. The reason for my answering the question in the way I did was that to state an increase in local improvement without also stating the corresponding decrease in general taxes would have been entirely misleading.—EDITOR.)

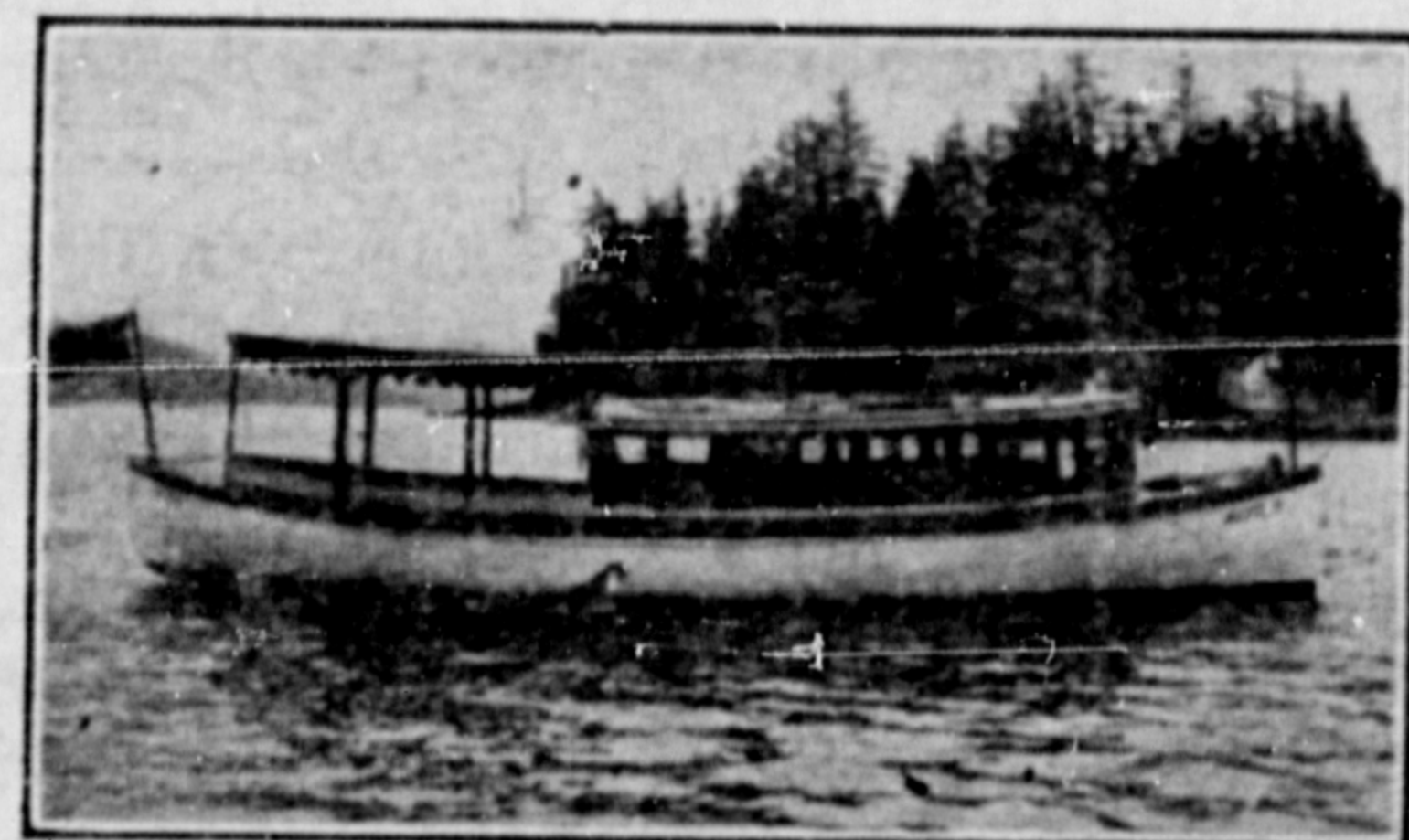
