PEACE ON EARTH

Another Christmas season finds the civilized world still in the throes of the bloodiest war in its history, and the old, old wish of "Peace on earth, goodwill toward men" seems oddly out of place. It seems odd to talk of goodwill while thousands of widows are being created every week and many thousands of children rendered fatherless; while tens of thousands of brave fellows are being maimed and riddled by their fellows. To speak of peace at such a time, sounds like calling "Peace, peace, when there is no peace."

Yet. in the hearts of those

who have suffered, there is the great peace which comes from the knowledge of duty nobly; done, and of sacrifice bravely borne. In the hearts of the fighters, there is the peace which comes from the knowledge that their cause is just, and that they are fighting in the best interests of peace. The outbreak of war was the first step towards peace, as it was simply the erruption which showed where the dispeace lay; an erruption which brought to light a malignant growth of dispeace which had been growing for forty years. In our hospitals, as in our trenches, there is a wonderful peace. Everyone who has visited the wounded has been struck with the calmness with which strong men face life, in the knowledge that they will always be cripples. There is no grumbling because of wounds or incapacities. They are peacefully satisfied to suffer, content in the knowledge that they are suffering in the cause of peace.

In our trenches, men are facing death complacently and smilingly, knowing a peace


