RUSSIAN SUCCESS

Reports from the Russian front are meagre, but all are decidedly reassuring. The evacuation of Czernowitz by the Germans is news of the utmost! importance, the enemy having occupied this city since last summer. It is clear that the activity of the Russians is seriously interfering with the PUBLIC OPINION movements of the Austro-German forces in the Near East. General Von Mackenzen, who was to have led the Turco-German expedition against Egypt. has now been recalled to more urgent business on the Russian front.

Von Mackenzen is the one general of real genius which Germany has discovered during the war and he is evidently having to work overtime. By the way, it appears that Mackenzen is not entitled to the "Von" by birth, simply having that distinction conferred upon him by the Kaiser. Mackenzen sounds so Scotch that in some quarters there is a belief that this gentleman is a descendant of some Scotch highlander who had located in Germany, and the fact that the "Von" is a recent addition adds color to this idea. He certainly has shown some Scotch fighting qualities.


