CONSTANTINE COMPLAINS

King Constantine seems to figure that the Allied occupation of Greece is similar to the German treatment of Belgium. Nothing could be further from the truth. Germany had signed a treaty with the other European powers which expressly prohibited the entering of Belgian territory, while the Allies made no such agreement regarding Greece. As a matter of fact, the only treaty broken in the Near East was that between Greece and Serbia, which called for Greek assistance against a Bulgarian invasion of Serbia.

Not only did Germany violate a treaty in entering Belgium, but she violated every law of humanity during that invasion. The German armies are living off the country which they wrongfully invaded, whilst the inhabitants of that country are dependent upon subscriptions from every corner of the globe in order that they may keep body and soul together. 
