SHELL CONTRACTS

The Journal yesterday reproduced at length the reply of Hon. Arthur Meighen to the charges made against the shell! committee by Hon. William Pugsley, Mr. Meighen's chief argument being that the shell committee was operating under the imperial government and therefore the Borden government could not start any enquiry.

It is true that the committee was appointed under the imperial government, but it is also true that it was appointed by THE BORDEN GOVERNMENT Evidently, Lloyd George, at that time, had sufficient confidence in the integrity of Canadian shell manufacturers and in the members of the Borden government to allow them to appoint the committee. To have sent someone from Britain to appoint the committee would have been casting a slur upon the honesty and patriotism of the Canadian officials.

The committee was appointed by Sir Sam Hughes, with the consent of the cabinet at Ottawa. The committee comprised chiefly men who were interested in the making of shells, and these men proceeded to let contracts to themselves at admittedly higher prices than obtained elsewhere, with the result that D. A. Thomas had to be sent over from Britain to find out where the huge profits were going. Lloyd George trusted the Canadian officials in appointing the shell committee, and Canada betrayed that trust.

Neither Mr. Meighen nor any other member of the Borden cabinet can evade the real issue. The recent speech in defence was an able piece of special pleading, but it only served to show that there is necessity for an enquiry. Gen-
