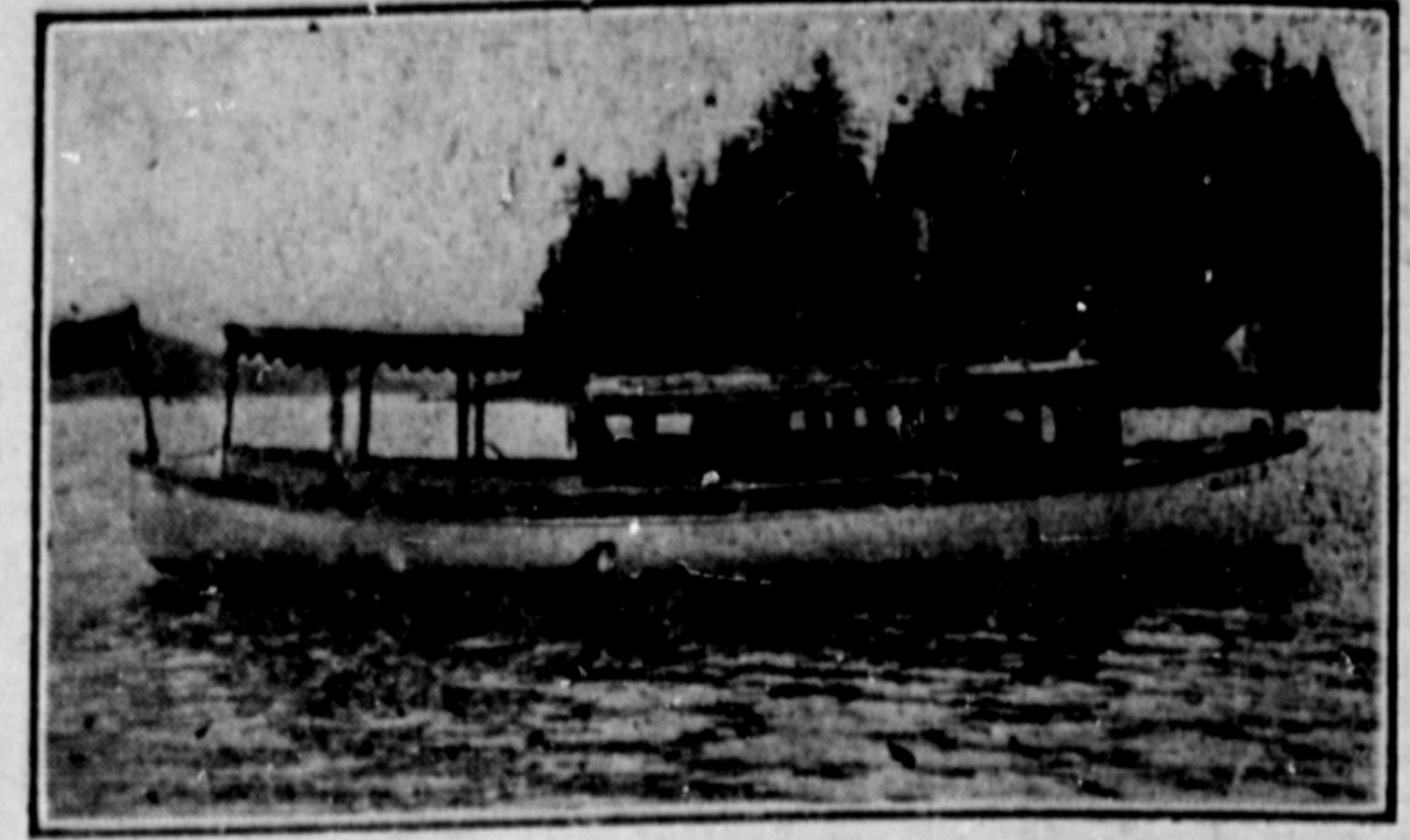

EXPLOSIVES MADE FROM KELP POTASH

Word comes from San Francisco that the Hercules Powder Company has proved the practicability of manufacturing potash for explosives from kelp, and that the company is proceeding to construct a reduction plant at San Diego, Cal., at a cost of over a million dollars.

A submarine reaper has been designed to collect the kelp from the ocean bed, and is proving a success. Orders have been placed for a hundred of these reapers and the industry is to be developed on a large scale.

This looks like another opportunity for Prince Rupert district. There is lots of kelp around, so it is up to some ingenious individual to stake kelp claims and get busy.
