The Conserva- FOR WILLIAM tives are very confident that the new members of the cabinet will be returned with large majorities, and it is possible that their confidence is not misplaced.

Both gentlemen have unlimited cash resources behind them, a very important matter from a Conservative standpoint, and they also have the added dignity of cabinet rank, which, like rank of any kind, seems to weigh heavily upon the imagination of many people. For the welfare of the province it is to be hoped that both members are defeated, as their defeat will not be in any sense a loss to the province.

Mr. Macdonald and Mr. Willson would both do splendid service for the province in oppositon during the short period of life before the Bowser administration, and would really be a source of strength to the government, if the political boss of the province were disposed to view matters from the highest standpoint. The greatest disaster which ever befell Sir Richard McBride was when he was returned with no opposition except two Socialist members.
