London, March 3 .- The British have struck a powerful blow against the enemy in the Ypres district, taking 800 yards of trenches.

All the attacks have been repulsed with heavy losses to the enemy.

Amsterdam, March 3 .-- A Zeppelin has been destroyed at Zeppne, in Belgium, while engaged in military work.

Portuguese Busy.

London, March 3 .- All German MINING ACTIVITY IN steamers lying at Panjim, a Portuguese colony in India, have been seized and the Portuguese flag hoisted and the crews interned.
