

Undoubtedly the most daring aeronautical feat on record was that performed by Lieut .- Colonel E. M. Maitland, who commands the Airship Section of the Naval Air Service, and who recently jumped from a balloon flying over London at a height of 10,000 feet, descending by parachute. Hitherto, the record seems to have been held by that intrepid balloonist, Captain Baldwin, who in 1887 claimed to have descended from a height of one mile (5,280ft.) in just over three minutes.

Colonel Maitland was fifteen minutes coming down, and he confessed that the most trying part of the experience fer him was before the parachute opened. He fell several hundred feet dead weight, and the suspense "seemed
