What Vancouver said a week ago, Victoria repeated most emphatically on Saturday, and the Bowser representative saved his deposit by less than a hundred votes, Mr. H. C. Brewster being returned to the legislature by nearly two votes to one. As in Vancouver, it was a triumph for the people rather than a party victory. Mr. Flumerfelt was a strong candidate in that he had earned a big reputation as a business man, and was singularly fortunate in having no political past, but he failed where the strongest man in the province must have failed. 
