There is a man who makes shoes for childrenand sells them to stores all over Canada But he is only just learning how people buy.

It was this way: His wife-let us call her Mrs. Brown-'phoned to him and asked him to buy some underwear for little Brown.

Picture Brown now among the throng of mothers at the "Children's Underwear" counter. He asks for Underwear for a child of six. He looks it over helplessly. What on earth does he know about Children's Underwear? For lack of anything better to say he asks: "Is this good quality?"
