noon.

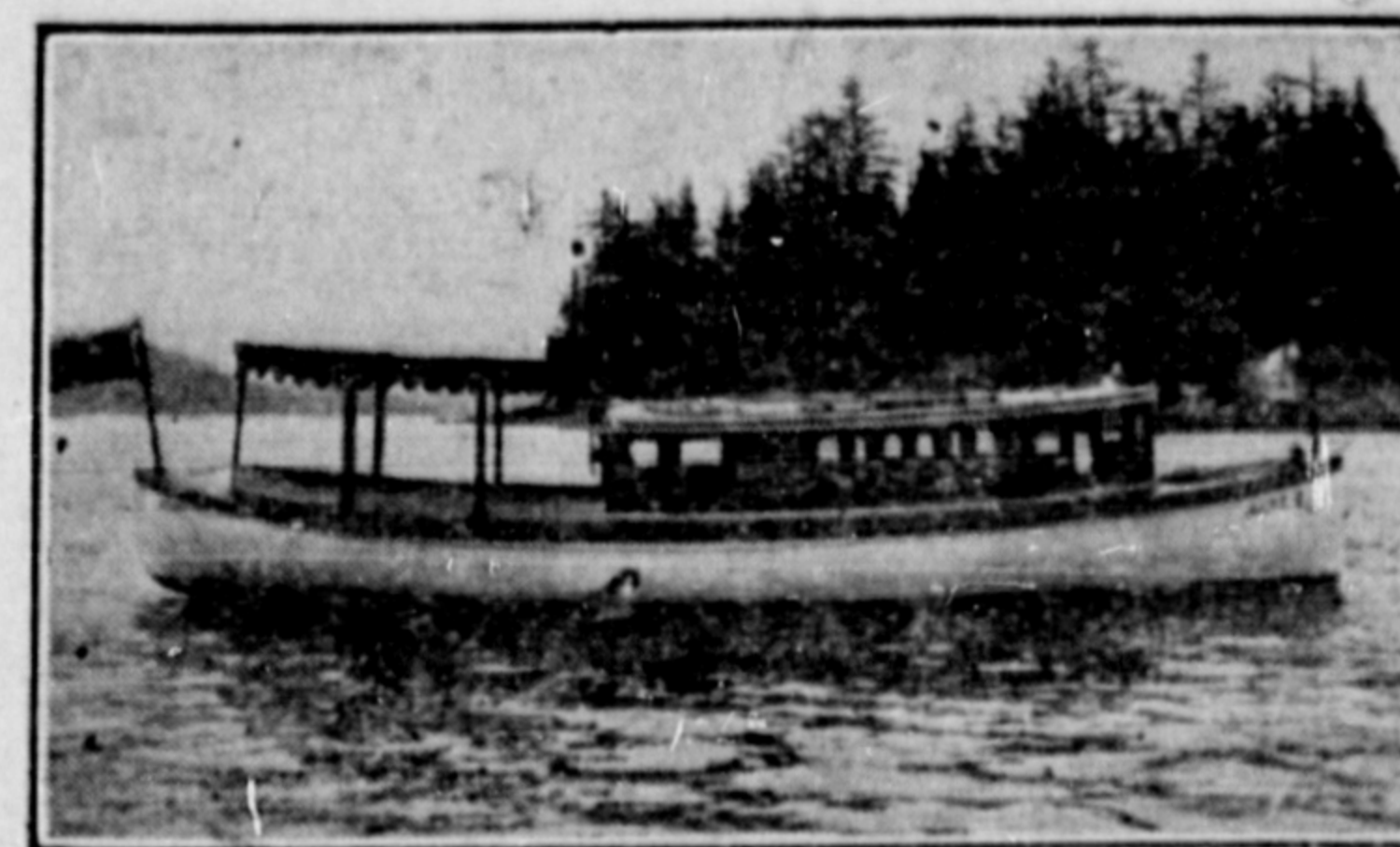
Edward C. Gibbons, of McCaf-
