## JOBBERY

The evidence given by W. S. McDonald at the enquiry in the building of the extension to the Parliament Buildings in Victoria is illuminating in regard to the methods of the Bowser politicians. In the first place the contractors were allowed to revise their tender, in order, it was stated, to eliminate an American firm whose tender was lower than that of McDonald & Wilson. We are not opposed to giving business on every occasion possible to home contractors, but this American firm had a branch at New Westminster, at least so it would appear from their tender, and it is very evident that they would have employed men from Victoria and probably Vancouver, in carrying on the work.

From the evidence given in the enquiry it would appear that the chief fault to be found with the lowest tenderer was that he would not be pliant enough in the hands of the politicians, who wanted their nominees to get the sub-contracts. The statement that Mr. McDonald was obliged, because of political pressure, to sub-let contracts to political nominees at a loss of \$39,000, as compared with the tenders of independent contractors, is . enough in itself to condemn the methods of these politicians.
