We publish in this issue the 80th annual statement of the Bank of British North America. which was presented at the annual meeting on March 7th last. The outstanding feature in the balance sheet is the bank's strength in liquid assets, the amount of bullion and legal tender notes, \$10,576,-299.00, being only \$545,066.00 less than that shown a year ago when we were undergoing! the strain and uncertainty of the early months of the war.
