## THE CONTRAST

Nothing could more clearly mark the contrast between the Liberals and the Tories in this province than their respective actions in regard to the demand for an investigation into election charges. The moment the Liberal leaders discovered that something crooked had been tried, they started an investigation which terminated in a warrant being issued for the arrest of the supposed guilty party. The information was laid by the Liberals, who also furnished a fast power boat for the use of the police in making the arrest.

In Victoria on election day a shebeen ran full blast until the Liberals complained to the police and had it stopped. The whole business was carefully squashed and no thorough investigation made as to who was responsible for the supplying of large quantities of liquor illegally. An effort was made by some members of Victoria city council to have the matter cleared up but nothing came of it. The notorious Harry Price, who was proven to be guilty of receiving a coal rake-off, was the active manager of the Victoria Tory campaign, in fact the Tories told each other that they simply must have Harry. They got him and his methods.

In Rossland, there are just as strong allegations as any that have been made in Vancouver, and it would be interesting to know, for instance, where all the betting money came from. Of course, according to Tory ideas of corruption, there is nothing corrupt in handing a man \$10 to bet on the Tory candidate. They consider that just as legitimate as handing the sub-contractors for the Parliament Building work

to party men at \$39,000 more than others bid.

The outstanding facts, are that there were irregularities in all three elections and that the Liberals are not only willing but anxious to investigate the one by which they are supposed to have profited while the Tories absolutely refuse to investigate the other two. If they are satisfied that everything was all right why do they refuse? What do they want to hide? The Liberals are anxious to lay every fact bare, why are the Tories so bashful?

## INVESTIGATION

The Journal, with its usual disregard for facts, insinuates that the alleged "plugging" was the means of returning Liberal "members" to the house. The Province takes the Vancouver Matsonian sheet to task for trying to convey the same idea, and states that "citizens may feel assured that the announced result of the poll was perfectly fair in that Mr. Macdonald got more votes than did Mr. Tisdall," and goes on to show that, if there was any "plugging," it was merely fractional. However, the size of the crime is not the important point and Mr. Macdonald and every Liberal worthy of the name is anxious to have the matter dug up to the very roots.

It is gratifying to find that the Journal at least gives M. A. Macdonald credit for having a conscience, as it claims that the knowledge of the irregularities has worried him. This is decidedly more than can be said of certain members of the government, who have sat complacently in the house for fourteen years in the knowledge that they actually owe

their seats to the coarsest kind of work. However, the knowledge has never worried them a trifle. "Get there and stay there" is their motto.

The Journal also repeats the cry that the Liberals have been able to prove no corruption in their investigations. To the Journal, this may be so, but, to ordinary people, the handling over of \$35,000 of the Songhees money to the party press; the giving of \$80,000 graft in the Kitsilano deal, which throughout was illegal, and the handling of the contracts on the Parliament Building extension by the politicians for their friends, is enough to condemn any government, and there is much more of the same to come.

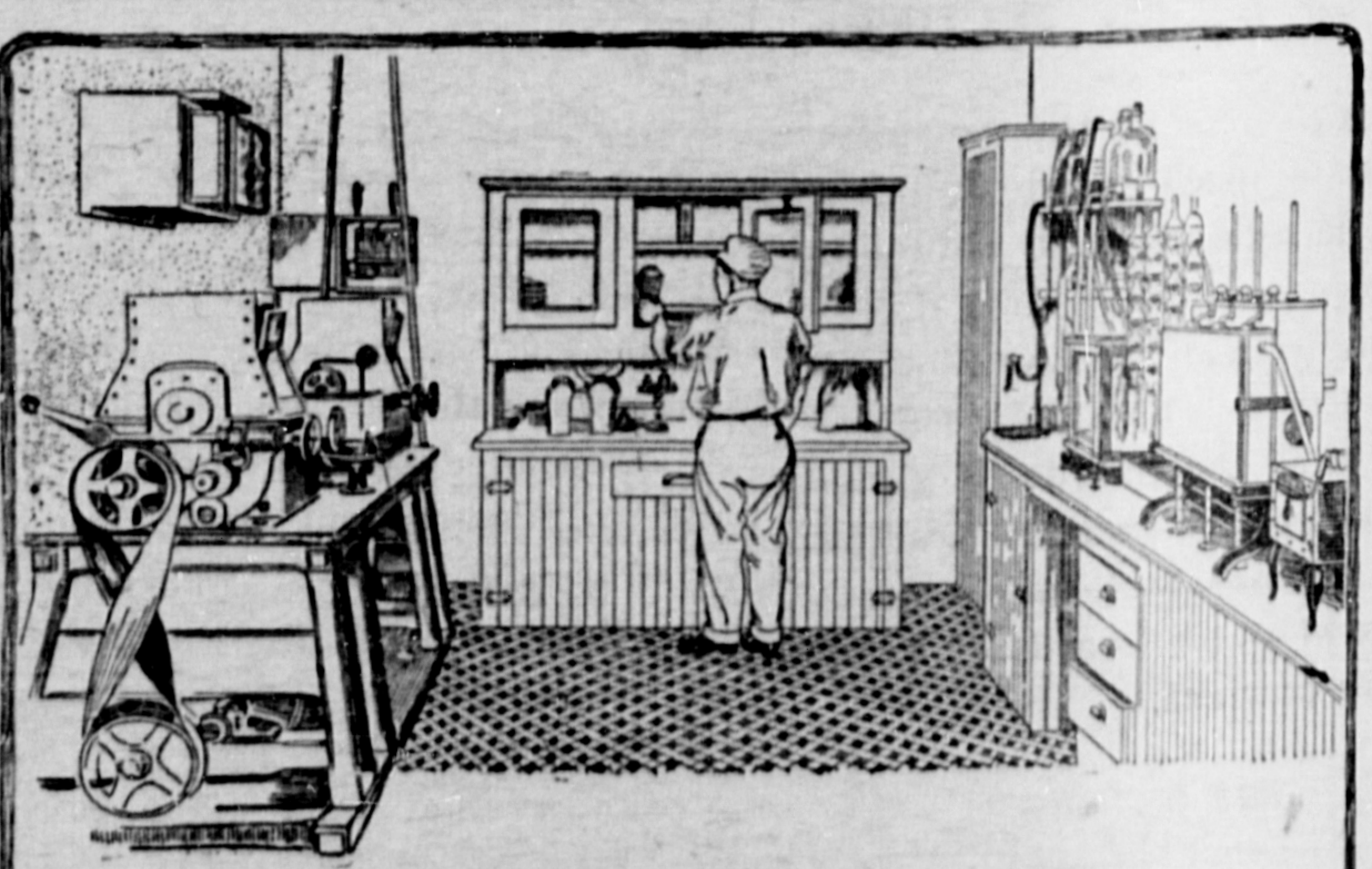
