teen wounded, but they were able to carry off their dead and wounded, the Germans having had enough of it.

Hec onfesses to being at times still being done by the French soldiers. The Canadian and British troops recently drafted to the front have taken over the trenches of the French in order to allow seasoned French troops to be transferred to the Verdun front. He is strongly of the opinion that the war will not last another winter.

One of the most striking scenes he has encountered is the French and Belgian farmer plowing and sowing up to within a mile of the firing line. The other day he saw a farmer sowing wheat while shells were bursting not more than a hundred yards away. Bob is looking forward to returning to Prince Rupert when his present job is over.
