VERDUN

If the report from Milan of mutiny amongst German troops at Verdun is correct, there is every reason to believe that the end is clearly in sight. In spite of the strict German censorship with its false reports to Berlin for public consumption, there is bound to be news of the real state of affairs leak through to the people of Germany. The censor cannot control the tongue of a wounded soldier, who has been horrorstruck by what has occurred before the great French fortress during the past few weeks, and it is bound to have its effect upon public opinion in Germany.

The Verdun attack was the most carefully planned of all the German efforts and it has been the most utter failure The French artillery has been far superior to that of the enemy, while the machine guns of the French have played deadly havoc with the hordes of advancing Germans. Deadly bayonet work at close quarters has completed the terrible tale of death.

To the layman, the outstanding feature of the attack has been its hopeless stupidity. Thousands upon thousands of German soldiers have been marched up to the mouths of the French guns only to be mowed down. Disaster has followed disaster, still the same tactics have been kept up with little variation. Had the Kaiser been a madman seeking to find out how many men could be slaughtered by a certain number of guns in a given time, he could not have brought about greater slaughter. Had the Allied leaders had a choice as to the German method and place of attack, they could not!


