## SIGNIFICANT ENDING OF THE GERMAN NOTE

(Continued From Page One.)

insuring freedom of the seas, a principle upon which the German government believes now, as before, that it is in agreement with the government of the United States.

### Evasive Proposal.

"The German government, being guided by this idea, notifies the government of the United States that German naval forces have received the following order: 'In accordance with the general principles of visit and search and the destruction of merchant vessels recognized by international law, such vessels, both within and without the area declared a naval war zone, shall not be sunk without warning and without saving human lives, unless the ship attempts to escape or offer resistance.'"

"But neutrals cannot expect that Germany, forced to fight for existence, shall for the sake of neutral interests restrict the use of an effective weapon if the enemy is permitted to continue to apply at will methods of warfare violating rules of international law. Such a demand would be incompatible with the character of neutrality and the German government is convinced that the government of the United States does not think of making such a demand, knowing that the government of the United States repeatedly declared that it is determined to restore the principle

of freedom of the seas from whatever quarter it has been violated.

### Liberty of Action Reserved.

"Accordingly, the German government is confident that in consequence of the new orders issued to the naval forces the government of the United States also now will consider all impediments removed which may have been in the way of mutual co-operation towards restoration of the freedom of the seas during the war as suggested in the note of July 23, 1915, and it does not doubt that the government of the United States will now demand and insist that the British government shall forthwith observe the rules of international law universally recognized before the war, as are laid down in the notes presented by the government of the United States to the British government December 28, 1914, and November 5, 1915.

"Should steps taken by the government of the United States not attain the object it desires, to have the laws of humanity followed by all belligerent nations, the German government would then be facing a new situation in which it must reserve to itself complete liberty of decision.

## WATER NOTICE
