controversy over board for which they were charged \$1.40 per day. Thinking that they had been over-charged, they demanded a detailed statement. This was refused and many of them left the camp and all quit work.

The men elected delegates and sent them with a written statement to Cameron, the contractor, giving the reasons why they would not work and asking that they be paid \$3.50 and \$4.00 for a nine-hour day with open shop, which would allow them to board where they pleased. Cameron told them to get their time and get out of camp, so that the work is still tied up.

Frank states that there is a little trouble over a contention of the Indians that the camp is on an Indian reserve. When this matter has been amicably settled, which he feels certain it will be shortly, the camp will proceed in its development.
