Canned salmon is bought subject to a ten per cent. examination at point of shipment, and, at present, all British Columbia salmon is inspected in the south. In view of the fact that there are so many canneries in the vicinity of Prince Rupert, why should not there be an inspector located here? At present, all shipments of canned salmon must of necessity go via Vancouver, while, if an inspector were located here, a large amount of the season's pack would be shipped direct from this point.

This year, in particular, there will be a large part of the pack shipped by rail to the east for shipment from Atlantic ports, owing to the shortage of ocean tonnage on the Pacific, Prince Rupert to Vancouver. fort to grab both.
