## SALMON INSPECTION

Canned salmon is bought subject to a ten per cent. examination at point of shipment, and, at present, all British Columbia salmon is inspected in the south. In view of the fact that there are so many canneries in the vicinity of Prince Rupert, why should not there be an inspector located here? At present, all shipments of canned salmon must of necessity go via Vancouver, while, if an inspector were located here, a large amount of the season's pack would be shipped direct from this point.

This year, in particular, there will be a large part of the pack shipped by rail to the east for shipment from Atlantic ports, owing to the shortage of ocean tonnage on the Pacific, and the placing of an inspector at this point would probably mean that a considerable proportion of this salmon would be handled at and shipped from Prince Rupert over the Grand Trunk Pacific, thus saving the consignee the freight from Prince Rupert to Vancouver. We have inspectors galore and, in all probability, one of the gentlemen who are at present engaged in fish inspection business could manage to find time to carry out the shipping inspection as well. According to the cannery-men, it is not very arduous work. This would tend to make Prince Rupert the centre of the northern salmon packing industry, while at present it is merely a transshipping point for the Orientals who come north for the season and go south at the end of it.

## SALMON PRICES

The establishment of independent canneries in this district will mean that the fishermen will receive a much better price for their fish. One authority stated the other day that

it would mean that the fishermen would get ten cents more per fish than they are able to get now. It is no secret that, at the present time, the cannerymen can quite nicely afford to pay this extra ten cents, and then some, and still have a handsome profit left. Roughly speaking, about four fish go to the case, and, if there are 120,000 cases of salmon put up on the Skeena this season, the extra ten cents would mean an additional \$50,000 to the fishermen. One can well imagine what this would mean to Prince Rupert, if the salmon fishing were entirely in the hands of independent fishermen.
