The Omineca is coaling at the Westholme wharf today preparatory to her leaving for the north.

Mrs. Knudson, who has been visiting in the south for some time, returned to town this morning.

A. C. Stewart, formerly inspector of schools in this district, came north on the Prince Rupert this trip.

Mrs. Thomas Barnes left this morning for Folkestone, England. Mr. Barnes has been on active service for some time.

The Prince John is to resume the schedule of the Prince Albert on June 13th, the Albert going south. The Alaskan run will be taken alternately by the Prince Rupert and the Prince George.

Rev. C. Daly arrived from the south this morning, accompanied by Mrs. Daly and family. Mr. Daly was Presbyterian minister in Summerland and is now on his way to take charge at Prince George.
