SALMON MONOPOLY

The breaking of the salmon fishing and canning monopoly is the most important question in British Columbia, to the people of Prince Rupert and the north generally. The facts of the case are familiar to all and need not be gone into at length at this time. Suffice it to say that the business of canning salmon is in the hands of a few, who control the salmon fishing of these northern waters in such a way that the white fisherman has no chance to make a living by fishing for salmon. The system of cannery boat-rating places the whole matter entirely in the hands of the cannerymen, as it keeps them entirely independent of the independent fisherman.

Towards the close of the legislature, Parker Williams introduced a resolution calling upon Ottawa to break the cannery boat-rating and to do away with the Pacific committee of the Fisheries Advisory Board, and to replace the latter by representatives of the canners and the fishermen. The doing away with the cannery boat-rating is the first step towards the freedom of the fishermen.

To this, William Manson, of Skeena, who ought to know conditions here thoroughly, moved an amendment to the effect that a royal commission


