#### KITCHENER

It is hard to realize that the dominant figure in British military affairs is no more, while it is the irony of fate that he should have met his death by what must have been more or less an accident of the sea. Kitchener, like all strong leaders, had his critics, but firmly implanted in the British mind/ was a supreme confidence in the genius of the man who brought peace in Egypt; who rounded off what the late Earl Roberts planned in South Africa; who placed the Indian army on an entirely new footing, and who, in later years, reorganized British military affairs in Egypt and the Mediterranean.

Kitchener was more than a soldier; he was a ruler. It cannot be said that he was loved, any more than it is possible to say that the pyramids could be loved. The feeling he engendered in his men, and in all with whom he came in contact, was one of the utmost trust. He was a leader and a ruler first, last and all the time. With an utter contempt for the officer who considered army rank from a social standpoint, Kitchener set to work to make the British army an efficient military machine, and it is no secret that, had he had his way, promotion from the ranks would long ago have been the popular procedure in the British army.


