POWER RATES FOR COOKING RANGES

The light committee presented to the council last night a report by Superintendent Kennedy in regard to the proposed charge for power for cooking ranges. The rates were from 3.5 cents per k. w. h. to 1 cent, according to the quantity used.

Ald. McClymont said that he understood that the cost of using an electric range would be about \$6.50 per month and that he felt that it would be a saving, when the extra cleanliness was taken into account.
Ald. Dybhavn said that he would like to have seen a minimum charge made, say of \$2.00 per month.

The mayor said that he understood that that question had been left to the superintendent.

Ald. D. C. McRae said that he did not think that the rates quoted would show a saving as compared to the use of coal and he favored a still lower rate if possible.

The mayor pointed out that the first rate quoted had been 4 cents and that it was being brought down and might be made lower yet, though they must keep in mind that manufacturers might come along and expect power at these very low rates. The report was adopted on the motion of Ald. Dybhavn, seconded by Ald. Smith.
