## BIG CELEBRATION FOR DOMINION DAY

At a public meeting in the city hall last evening, with Ben Self in the chair, the question of arranging for Dominion Day sports was discussed. It was intimated that Mr. Stackpole, of Ketchikan, had arranged for a hundred or more excursionists to accompany the Ketchikan ball team here and that there was a possibility of Granby and Alice Arm sending along teams. It was felt that the city should be asked to assist in the arrangements.

Mayor McCaffery said that he expected that several teams would be released from Shawatlans on Wednesday and he would arrange that they be set to work to improve Recreation Park. He assured the boys that he would do all he could towards making the day a success.

The following committees were appointed: Sports, Chief Vickers, Fire Chief Macdonald, Canon Rix, George Bryant, A. J. Prudhomme and S. J. Winsby.

Finance: V. A. Cole, George D. Tite and George Frizzell.

Baseball: Ben Self, J. McNulty and W. D. Vance.

Advertising: J. R. Beatty, Geo. W. Morrow, D. R. Kennedy, J. Judge, A. Clapperton and William Turnbull. Secretary, R. P. Moore.

The committees will meet on Wednesday evening at the city hall to decide upon plans for the making of this Dominion Day one of the most successful in the history of the city. J. R. Beatty will probably go up to Granby to arrange with the ball teams as to their coming here.

V. A. Cole, of the finance committee, was delegated to meet the council to ask for financial assistance. Contributions to the funds for the carrying out of the sports will be thankfully received by the members of the finance committee.

If arrangements can be made there will be ball games between Prince Rupert, Ketchikan, Granby and Alice Arm and there is certain to be a large number of visitors in the city. If there is enough money forthcoming to give promise of first-class sports, it will add to that number and an influx of visitors would be a good thing for the city.

the table for a week. Ald. Nelson seconded the motion.

On a vote being taken, Ald. Smith and Nelson voted for the amendment and Ald. Dybhavn and McRae for the motion, the mayor without a moment's hesitation declaring the motion carried, and the finding of the finance committee adopted.

In conversation with The Daily News, after the meeting, Mayor McCaffery gave his reasons for his decision. He said, "When the electors sent me to the city hall, I had two main objects in view. One was to place the city on a sound financial basis, and the other was to strike the lowest possible tax rate, and in this my council have given me every support.

"When the hotel-keepers asked for a reduction which amounted to \$4,900 a year, the estimates had already been made up and the tax rate struck. In the estimates, the hotels were figured at \$1,000 each and to have given them back \$4,900 simply meant collecting that much more from the ratepayers. The only question before me was to decide between the hotel-keepers and the ratepayers, and I had no hesitation in deciding as I did, as I believe that scarcely one ratepayer would have favored the reduction to the hotels."

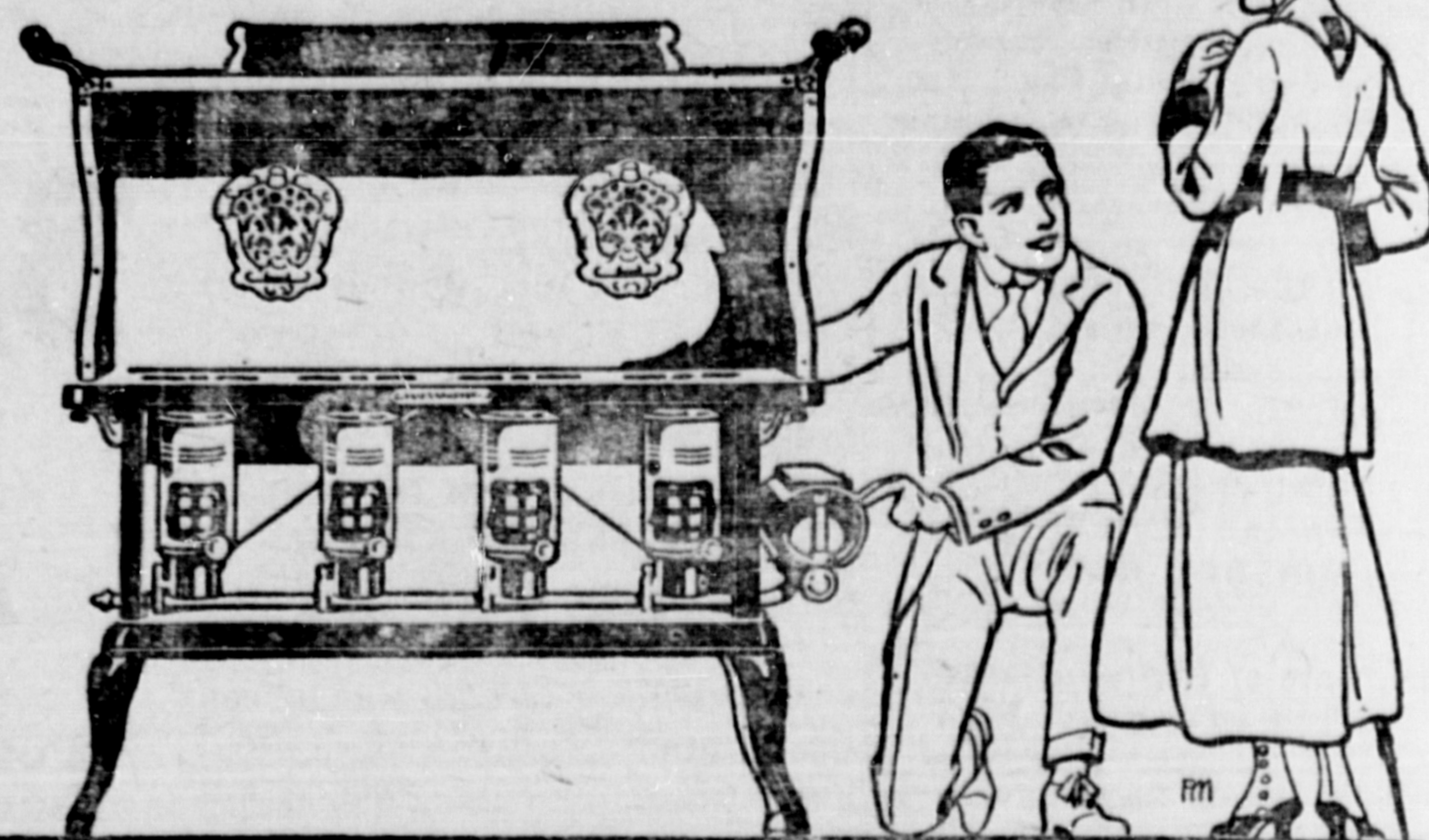
