**IRELAND**

It is typical of the British temperament that cabinet ministers should squabble and fight bitterly over domestic problems, while the nation is taking part in a life and death struggle, and it was this British characteristic which misled Germany in regard to affairs in Ireland at the outbreak of the war. It is true that there was then, and is still, a fairly large number of rebellious spirits in the Emerald Isle, but Germany was very far out in her calculations when she figured that the outbreak of war would see a general uprising in Ireland.

Probably the German press will be hailing the latest cabinet split over Irish affairs as something approaching civil war in Britain, as the Germans seem to be quite incapable of arriving at a true estimate of the British character, and an understanding of the British spirit.

In the latest break, Walter Long, one of the old school of Conservatives, seems to have usurped the place of Sir Edward Carson in an effort to hinder the Lloyd George Home Rule measure from going into effect. He and his followers take the stand that, though they are members of the government, they only became ministers in order to help out the war situation, and that their position in the cabinet councils does not mean that they should sink their old party allegiance to the Union.

It is unfortunate that such a question should have been raised at this time, but it was unavoidable, as the situation in Ireland demanded immediate action. The Unionists in the north are as bitterly opposed to a parliament in Dublin as ever, and the only solution that will satisfy them is a separate legislature, say in Belfast, to take care of the north, thus splitting Ireland in two. It

would appear at the moment that the best plan would be for the Unionists to agree to the Dublin parliament, under the premiership of John Redmond, until the end of the war. This would give the Nationalists an opportunity to try their hand at government for a short period and, at the end of that time, the north might probably be disposed to forget their antipathies and be content to try and make Ireland one prosperous whole. If the Dublin parliament is a failure, the first to admit it will be John Redmond, and the north will then have an opportunity to make their own plans clear.

The one outstanding feature is that some kind of Home Rule must, and will be, set up in Ireland, whether under one or two parliaments. If, until the end of the war, the two parties get together and try to do their best for the country, and forget for a time their religious and other differences, the chances are that each will come to the conclusion that the other is not such a bad fellow after all, and that, though they may agree to differ on some things, they may both agree thoroughly on the promotion of the general welfare of Ireland.

**CITY TREASURER'S VALUE APPRECIATED**

The finance committee recommended to the council Monday night that City Treasurer E. D. Johnson's salary be advanced \$25 per month. Mayor McCaffery said that the council's policy was one of keeping down expense but that the committee had considered the matter carefully and each member was satisfied that, in view of the inestimable value of Mr. Johnson to the city, the advance should be made. The report was adopted on the motion of Ald. Dybhavn, seconded by Ald. McRae.

**STREET LIGHTING**

The fire and light committee presented a report of Light Superintendent Kennedy to the council Monday night, suggesting that the rate charged for the lighting of the city streets be reduced from 12 cents per k. w. h. to 7 cents.

The mayor said that the matter had been gone into fully by Mr. Kennedy and the treasurer before the recommendation was made. On the motion of Ald. Dybhavn, seconded by Ald. Smith, the report was adopted.

**ELECTRIC COOKING**

At the council Monday night, the mayor intimated that Light Superintendent Kennedy figured that the cost of cooking and heating water by electricity would be around \$6.00 a month, which is lower than was understood. An electric range will be used for one month as an experiment to find out just exactly what it costs and a further announcement will be made. Mayor McCaffery said it was the intention of the council that cooking by electricity be, if possible, brought below the cost of using coal.

Ald. McRae said he was glad to learn that the cost would be lower than at first understood. He thought the council should get busy and do some demonstration work to promote the use of power.
