PROMISES

The Journal is a little more honest than the Hon. W. R. Ross, in that it freely admits that the Bowser northern tour was for purely party purposes. Ross tried to tell the electors that it was undertaken in order to find out the needs of the various districts. Bowser and his staff must have turned south at Prince George full of valuable information, the chief item being that the north does not want Bowser, no matter how badly Bowser may want the north.

The local Tory organ devotes the bulk of its space to an interview with the local Tory boss and the article reads like a Berlin war despatch, in that it is full of hope, but contains the minimum of fact. It says "the premier was careful to make no promises," and a little further on it says that he promised that the government engineer would visit the Terrace district to go into the matter of a bridge which is wanted. There was also a flagrant attempt at vote buying in the Bulkley by promising another bridge, while Prince George electors were promised that more money would be voted for the completion of the P. G. E. to the Peace River. The tour speeches were full of promises, but the tour itself promised little for the Tories.

William Manson, according to the Tory sheet, was given a "splendid reception." As the same was said of his cold bath experience in Prince Rupert, this may be taken simply as the ordinary Tory mode of expression, when referring to any temporary minister. Poor William knows in his heart just what kind of a reception he received, and it would not improve his temper to read the Journal account.

William Manson seems to have made one discovery in the course of the trip, and the settlers who are left in the interior must have hailed it as

brilliant in the extreme. William stated with all the solemnity and air of wisdom of a Solomon that "mixed farming was what was wanted in this district." How he ever managed to make such a discovery is beyond the comprehension of any rancher. Who would ever have dreamed of such a thing? William must have felt like a real live Minister of Agriculture when he released this weighty thought from his brain. It must have staggered the ranchers, and it is to be hoped that he broke it gently.

NOTES AND COMMENTS

At the secret session of the Reichstag held the other day, Chancellor Von Bethmann-Hollweg evidently thought it was time to warn the German people to prepare for the worst. Cheer up, Mr. Chancellor, the worst is yet to come.

Joe has evidently been instructed to try to inject a little hope into the local Tories, but Joe does not carry around a hopeful expression on his countenance these days.

While the Tory organ hollers about sweeping the province it well knows that the Tory broom is played out and that Bowser and his staff are at their wits end to know what to do next to stall off disaster.

All the guesses as to the next Governor-General have proven to be wrong and the Duke of Devonshire is to succeed the Duke of Connaught. If the present Duke of Devonshire is of the same calibre as his father, he will be the right man in the right place and a worthy successor to the present Governor-General.

H. B. Thomson, who represented the liquor interests in the Bowser northern tour, has already returned home. Mr. Thomson is not enthusiastic over his northern journey and gets quite im-



patient when anyone mentions Prince Rupert.

The Journal must have got some of the Russian war news mixed up with its political dope when it spoke of the Tories "sweeping the north." It omitted to mention how many prisoners were taken.
