



Another Table Surprise Chocolate Cream Dessert

First place one full cup of "Canada First" Evaporated Milk in a bowl of ice (this is for whipping). Then mix thoroughly 5 tablespoonsful cornstarch, 3 cup sugar, pinch of salt, 3 tablespoons cold water, 3 tablespoons "Canada First" Evaporated Milk. H. S. CLEMENTS AND THE FISHING SITUATION

H. S. Clements, M. P., conferred with the fisheries committee of the Board of Trade on Tuesday afternoon regarding the fishing situation in Prince Rupert. The proposed legislation by the United States government in regard to the shipping of fish across the line through Canada was freely discussed and Mr. Clements expressed the opinion that the legislation would not be passed.

W. P. Lynch, G. L. Clayton and W. E. Williams were of the opinion that Ottawa should treat the matter as if it would become effective and a resolution calling upon the government at Ottawa to take up the question of deep sea fisheries with a view to placing the situation before the United States government was proposed by W. E. Williams and seconded by G. A. Woodland, and carried unanimously.

The question of shipping "culls" by boat to Seattle was also discussed and Mr. Clements was of the opinion that Prince Rupert need look for no alteration in the present ruling on this side of the business.
