In March, 1915, an order-incouncil was made to encourage American fishermen to bring their fish to Prince Rupert. In the past fifteen months the results have been gratifying and so much American fish was brought to this port that American fish-buying firms opened up branches here. The American firms found a ready market for their small and large fish in Seattle and they were allowed to ship them there in bond by steamer.
