MACHINE OIL

F. W. Welsh, one of the candidates on the original Tory Vancouver ticket who was withdrawn after the Sullivan affair, has got into another mess. The Bowser machine has always required a plentiful supply of oil and it has been an open secret for long that the general public of the province provided most of that commodity though it was, of course, obtained by painless extraction. The enquiry conducted by Mr. Justice Murphy into contracts procured from the Vancouver School Board sheds some interesting light upon the Tory methods of extraction. J. C. Pendray, a soap manufacturer of Victoria, wanted to secure a contract for soap from the board, and F. W. Welsh, a member of the board and president of the local Conservative Association, made it abundant_ ly plain that a contribution to the Tory machine would not be unwelcome, to put the matter gently. Mr. Pendray came through with \$25, but, to make sure that he did not come out on the wrong side, he added that amount to the contract price. In other words, the School Board, or rather the taxpayers of Vancouver, contributed that \$25 to the Bowser fund.
