**OUR LEADERS**

There arrived in Prince Rupert this morning two men who will play very prominent parts in the rebuilding of the province of British Columbia. H. C. Brewster, leader of the opposition in the late legislature, needs no introduction to the people of Prince Rupert. All along the coast, and throughout the province, he has been known for years as a man of sterling character and solid business ability, who has striven hard to bring about cleaner and more democratic government in British Columbia.

M. A. Macdonald is not so well known, though, in the past three months, he has bulked more largely in the public eye than his chief. Mr. Macdonald is a young man of rare ability, who, in honesty of purpose and fighting power of the real old highland type, has proven an able lieutenant to the Liberal leader in the strenuous session of the Legislature which closed at the end of May, or perhaps on March 14th. The exact date depends on the decision of the courts.

How those two stalwarts carried Vancouver and Victoria for the Liberals in the by-elections needs no retelling. Their entry into the house caused the Bowser bunch to do some furious thinking and many anxious hours were spent in drawing up every conceivable kind of legislation which seemed to carry with it the hope of support at the polls. The fact that so much work was done during the last session was entirely due to the members of the opposition, and the fact that much of that work was done very crudely was due to the haste of Bowser and Company in rushing through everything that looked like an election plank. Planks were freely stolen from the Liberal platform and launched as real Tory timber.

To quote Mr. Brewster, "The Liberal party has done more for the people of British Columbia

out of power than the Conservative party in."

Chagrined at the tremendous turn in the political tide, the Bowser machinists made M. A. Macdonald a target for the most infamous attacks ever directed at a public man in this Dominion. What the Bowser machine is capable of needs no explaining to the people of the north, where it has been carrying on its nefarious work for years. Mr. Macdonald has passed through the fire of the enemy unscathed and is the stronger for the battle. His opponents in the south have gone to pieces, as witness F. W. Welsh, one of the strong Tory witnesses in the "plugging" charges. In the enquiry into the Vancouver school board contracts, this gentleman came out in his true colors and another example of Bowser machine methods was laid bare.

Buying the support of such men as John L. Sullivan, and his friends in Seattle, is just on a par with the selling of soap contracts to parties who will contribute to the machine oil fund. Incidentally, the public ultimately pays full price for the oil and John L. Sullivan and his gang get the benefit of it.

A new era has dawned in British Columbia; the get-rich-quick dream is over and, with its passing, must go the real estate government to which every piece of legislative work wassimplly a "deal" to be put through to the best advantage of the party and its friends. The process of rebuilding will necessarily be slow, but under the guidance of such men as H. C. Brewster and M. A. Macdonald, with a strong backing of clean, honest men in the south, and men of the type of T. D. Pattullo, Frank Mobley and A. M. Manson from the north, the province will enter upon a stage of real prosperity, built upon a solid foundation of truth and respect for the rights of all men, of whatever political creed.
