**WELSH GONE**

The Tory machine house-cleaning goes on apace in Vancouver, and the latest clean-up is the sending abroad of F. W. Welsh. Like Sir Richard McBride, he is not lost to the party, or the machine, but has simply gone to London as a kind of advance agent. After the revelations in the Sullivan "plugging" scandal, it was felt advisable to have Mr. Welsh step down from his place on the Bowser ticket, if such a step could be reckoned as being downward. When the school board scandals were brought out into the light of day, it was evidently decided that the climate of British Columbia did not agree with Mr. Welsh's health and that he had better join Sir Richard in London, as a representative of the Bowser machine in registering the soldier voters.

London is becoming a regular dumping ground for Tory discards from this province, and to be "sent to London" will now be a popular phrase in political circles, though it will not sound very sweetly to the ears of the party sent. It will be remembered that F. W. Welsh is the gentleman who gave much of the evidence in the "plugging" enquiry. He was mixed in with the Seattle jail-birds to lend an air of respectability to a party composed of Sir Dick's old friend "Broekie Phil" and the rest of the Sullivan gang. Since we now know of his dealings in soap, it is easy to understand why the machine figured he would lend an atmosphere of cleanliness of the desperately dirty proceedings.

That Mr. Welsh will prove an efficient servant of the machine in London goes without saying. He has a convenient memory, as was shown in the "plugging" enquiry and also in the soap deal. He can forget just at the right time, while he has a wonderful faculty for reading cryptic wireless messages. It will also be remem-

bered that it was in rooms over Mr. Welsh's store that the Seattle "gentlemen" were housed, though Mr. Welsh was innocent of all knowledge of the fact, though he had received a wireless message from Sullivan so that he might meet his friends from Seattle on their arrival.

The meeting between the ex-grocer and ex-school board trustee and Sir Richard McBride will be touching in the extreme. They will have much in common, in that they are both discards of the Bowser machine who are reckoned to be more useful at a distance of a few thousand miles than at home. The reports do not state as to whether John L. Sullivan and the rest of the crew travelled with Mr. Welsh, but, in any case, Johnny can keep in touch with his old friend by wireless, or at least by cable. Doubtless Mr. Welsh's record has preceded him and he will be given a great reception by the boys in Bramshott and the other camps. The boys who are so busy learning how to "plug" Germans must appreciate the ability of the gentleman from Vancouver.

**NOTES AND COMMENTS**

Sir George Perley has returned and it depends upon the Meredith-Duff report as to whether Sir Sam Hughes goes to London, at least so Ottawa rumor says.

The Bowser machine evidently thinks that F. W. Welsh's services are too valuable to be dispensed with but that it is safer to use them some thousands of miles away from Vancouver.

The Journal tries to show that the "Miscellaneous" \$3,000,000 in the public accounts should not be termed so. The term was given by the McBride-Bowser government. The term is used to cover up a multitude of over-expenditures. For instance, the appropriation for civil administration in 1913 was \$1,706,000 and the expenditure was about \$2,500,000.

In spite of the fact that we have an expensive attorney-general's department, huge sums are paid out as sundries for legal services.

**LIGHT SUPERINTENDENT**

On the motion of Ald. McRae, seconded by Ald. McClymont, it was decided at the city council last night to confirm the appointment of D. R. Kennedy as superintendent of light and phone departments.

Ald. Smith asked if the term of three months probation was up. The mayor said that it was not quite up but that the council was satisfied that confirmation should be made.

Ald. Barrie took exception to the manner in which Mr. Kennedy had been hired, the applications never having been before the council.

Mayor McCaffery said that he was pleased to accept the responsibility for his action. Circumstances caused him to be in Vancouver; the applicants were all there, and he had no hesitation in hiring Mr. Kennedy on probation. He believed that his judgment had been sound.

Letters from the managers of the local branches of banks, protesting against the license fee of \$200, were presented to the city council last night. On the motion of Ald. McClymont, seconded by Ald. Nelson, it was decided that no reduction could be made.

Besides placing the rates upon a more equitable basis, the new system will entail less book-keeping while it will be figured out so that the total earnings will not be reduced.


