WAKE UP

The local Tory organ goes to sleep for a few days and then wakes up rubbing its eyes. Evidently still in a more or less comatose state, it accuses the Daily News of perverting the facts in regard to E. W. Welsh and the ignominious part the Vancouver School Board soap contract distributor played in conjunction with the notorious John L. Sullivan in the Vancouver election scandal.

Mr. Welsh admitted receiving a letter from John L. Sullivan in Seattle and also admitted that he was careful enough to destroy that incriminating document and to forget all that it contained. He claimed that Sullivan sent him wireless messages "warning him" of what was taking place. The wireless messages were produced at the enquiry and were found to be very different from what Mr. Welsh stated on oath. They were UNSIGNED messages, yet Mr. Welsh required no enlightenment as to the sender. He was expecting them. The messages simply described the "pluggers" in order that Welsh and friends might make no mistake. There is no evidence that the "well" pluggers voted for Mr. Macdonald, further than the word of men whose word is worthless. E. W. Welsh, according to his own statement, knew that the plugging was to take place; he knew the details of the whole criminal plot and he had to be got out of the way, as the Tories dared not run him as a candidate in Vancouver.

Mr. Macdonald faces the world four-square as an honest man can, but Welsh has had to seek pastures new at the

other side of the world. E. W. Welsh, the Bowser machinist, who inveigled first \$50 and then \$25 out of a soap contractor, and then advised him to make the people of Vancouver pay for those contributions to the Bowser funds, has been sent to England to "take care of" the soldiers' votes. The sending of such a man on such a mission is perhaps the most flagrant piece of blackguardism ever perpetrated upon the long-suffering people of this province. The next move, just in order to round off the business, should be the appointment of John L. Sullivan to an honorary colonelcy in order that he may again lend his invaluable aid to the machine. All the crooked work which such men are able to bring off will be defeated by the people of British Columbia, just as it was in the by-elections in Vancouver and Victoria, where Harry Price bought votes "at his own expense" and bought whisky for the election day "blind-piggers." The whole miserable Bowser game is up and none know it better than the men who have clung to the machine in order that they might gain a few crumbs which the men at the top might drop.

"BRITAIN PREPARED" COMING TO WEST HOLME

"Britain Prepared," the ten-reel series of naval and military pictures taken at the command of the Admiralty and the War Office, has had a tremendously successful run in the theatres of the big Canadian cities. These pictures were first shown in London, England, the King and Queen present. Lord Fisher, the idol of the British fleet, made an opening address while the Right Hon. A. J. Balfour introduced the various pictures. Wherever they have been shown, they have created a sensation and people have willingly paid a dollar to see them and have gone back again.

These pictures are to be shown in the Westholme Theatre next Wednesday and you cannot afford to miss them. There is no possibility of the management making money out of this show, but it is produced here for purely patriotic purposes. If expenses are cleared, the management will be more than satisfied. This is something entirely different from the usual run of so-called "war" pictures.
