# DASTARDLY PLOT

It becomes more clear every day that the "Military Forces Voting Act" was not framed through any patriotic motive. but simply as a diabolical attempt to set at nought the will of the people of this province, under the guise of an effort on behalf of the soldiers. No man is more entitled to consideration than the man who is willing to lay down his life for his country, but when the Bawser machine seeks to use him as a pawn in their nefarious schemes it is time for the public of British Columbia to rise up in their wrath and demand an explanation.


