PROBLEMS OF ORIENT VIEWED BY CANADIAN

G. G. S. Lindsey, K. C., who has just returned to Canada after an extended stay in China, during which time he carried through big financial operations with the Chinese government on behalf of a big financial group, in connection with the mineral development of China. After completing the arrangements, Mr. Lindsey was asked by the late president of China to draft mining laws for that country. During his visit he formed a very high opinion of the industrial possibilities of the Oriental republic, says the Toronto Globe. Mr. Lindsey's work brought him into close touch with the most prominent men in China and he has a very high opinion of those gentlemen.

The mineral areas of China, says Mr. Lindsey, have never been developed except coal, iron, copper, lead and antimony on a very small scale. Under the old mining laws, foreigners are not permitted to work in China and the Chinese themselves have shown little inclination to do development work. Mr. Lindsey caused a commission to be appointed and laws have been drafted which should prove advantageous in developing the mineral resources of this, the largest country in the world.

In dealing with the Chinese political situation, Mr. Lindsey said that the cause of the recent revolution is dead with the late president, but, for some reason, the revolution is still very much alive. The most important political happening in China recently is the signing of the treaty between Japan and Russia by which Japan gets control of Manchuria and its railroads. Mr. Lindsey is of the opinion that Yuan Shi Kai was strong enough to stem the tide of Japanese aggression but that the future of China now depends largely upon the outcome of the present war.
