WHERE DID IT GO?

The Victoria Colonist is publishing a series of epistles to H. C. Brewster. In No. 2. it defends the handing over of millions to the P. G. E., and the Victoria Times replies as follows:

We are again told by the government press that Foley, Welch & Stewart have sunk \$9,000,000 "of their own money" in the Pacific Great Eastern Railway. Where did it go? Who got it? According to the government's chief engineer the road to date cost \$18,-800,000, and according to the minister of railways practically all of it came from the funds raised on the credit of the province and held in a trust account to be paid out pro rata with construction up to completion. And this was nearly \$7,000,00 more than the company was entitled to according to the provision of the law which when it was passed was lauded by the government and the Colonist as safeguarding to the utmost the public interest. That law as it affects the company is held by the government to be a dead letter; as it affects the people it is very much alive, for they are now paying the interest on the bonds guaranteed by them under its provisions.
