The general opinion amongst the vast majority of people in Vancouver is that not a single Bowser representative will be returned for that city at the general election.

The recent amendment to the act made the change possible, and Point Grey, which, like Prince Rupert, had for years been trying to find a way out of a serious situation, insisted upon the government coming to an arrangement under which arrears of taxes were assumed and taxes up to 1920 guaranteed by the government.

There is no truth in the rumor that William Manson took a gramophone and several records of H. H. Stevens' speeches with him to the Islands and that Joe was to run the show.

The information regarding the Point Grey deal came to our civic authorities through the medium of the press, and City Solicitor Peters at once took the matter up with the reeve of Point Grey and is now going into the matter direct with Victoria.

Throughout the province there is a demand for a change of government. The province has been short-changed so often that one cannot wonder at the demand.

The real issue in the provincial campaign is the handing over of the province to the railroad magnate and the speculator. The Bowser government admits that it has done both, yet it has the nerve to ask to be returned to power.

The Bowser press is paid to state that Brewster's terms for the extension of the life of parliament were impossible. The only matter on which Bowser and Brewster differed on that occasion was the paying of \$15,000 a year to Sir Richard McBride.
