RECRUITING

It is satisfactory to learn that Ottawa is revising Canadian recruiting methods and that an effort will be made to bring some sort of system where overlapping has been the general rule.

The cause of this trouble was of course the enormous number of commissioned officers, with political influence, who had to be attached somewhere.

It is to be hoped that the only qualification for the post of director of recruiting will be experience and ability and that such positions will be given entirely to returned soldiers, who are bound to be much more effective recruiting agents than civilians who have never seen service.

SOLDIERS' VOTING

That the Bowser method of taking the soldiers' vote has caused a good deal of comment

in Britain is evident from the fact that questions have been asked regarding it in the House of Commons, and that a request has been made for a report as to machinery employed in the election.

It is to be hoped that the members of the House are provided with copies of the Soldiers' Voting Act. That is all they require, in order to be enlightened as to the machinery employed.

If the members are familiar with the activities of "Soapy" Welsh, in regard to the Vancouver school board contracts, they will be further enlightened as to the possibilities of the act, when it is interpreted and administered by an energetic disciple of Bowser.

FAREWELL DANCE

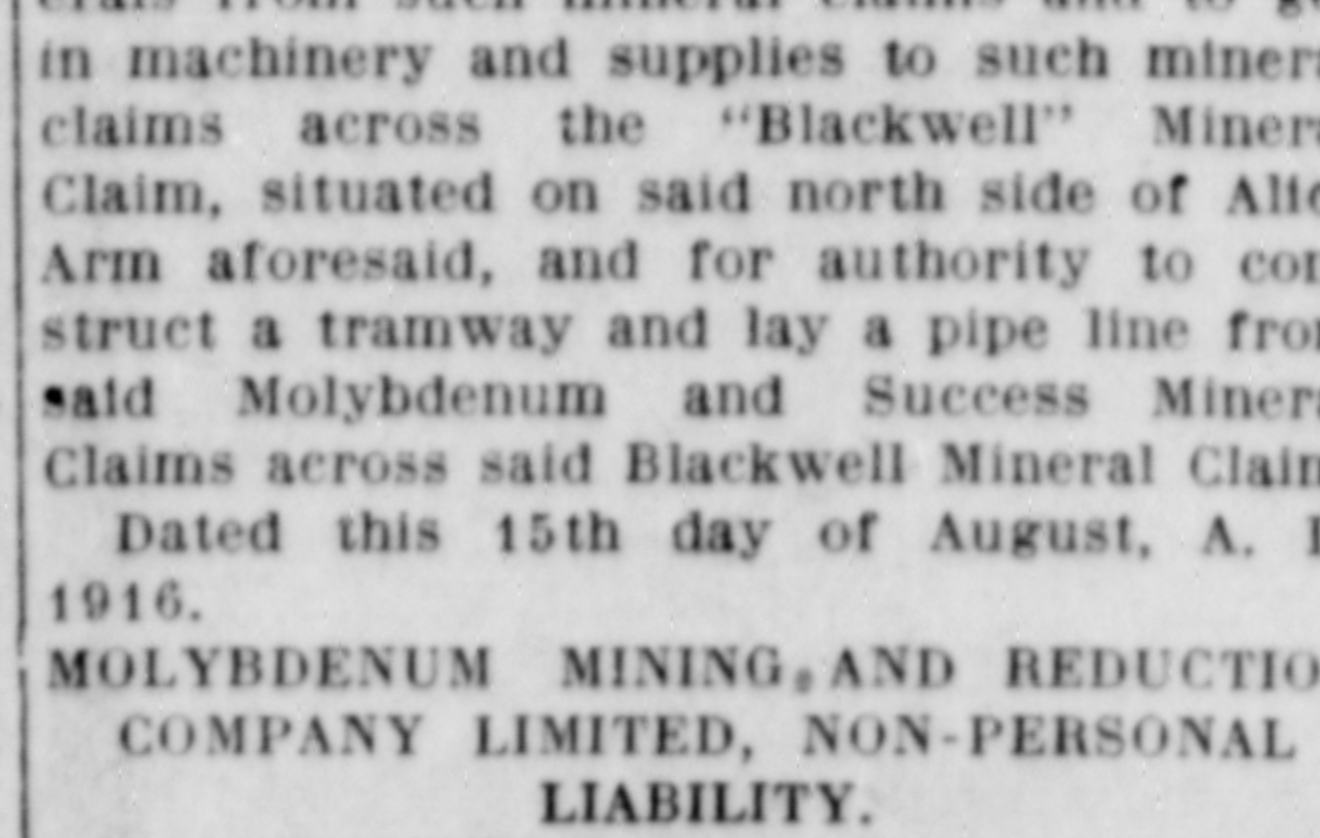
