COLONIZATION

When a party of Norwegians wrote to the department of lands at Victoria enquiring as to the possibility of securing land on which to create a colony, Hon. W. R. Ross replied that the British Columbia government was not in the colonizing business. Mr. Ross stated the truth very baldly and he might have added that the government was simply running a glorified Real Estate Exchange, in which the plums and the commissions went to the men who helped to keep the machine in good working order.

One of the biggest problems which will face the Brewster government will be the question of colonization. Immigrants have been brought to this province in tens of thousands in the past, and, when the war is over, many more thousands will come. Every British Columbia soldier who has gone to Europe is, unconsciously, an advertising agent, and results will follow and it will be one of the most important duties of the government to prepare for them.

At the present time, this province is ill-prepared to receive any great influx of settlers of any kind. Our cities do not need them, and, when the boys return from Europe and the thousands who are at present engaged in making munitions are released, there will be serious problems to be faced. However, settlers will come in, whether we want them or not. The war has unsettled tens of thousands of young men of energy in the old country and many of those young fellows will turn to Canada as an outlet for their energies. These men would be an asset to any country and it would be poor policy to turn them away, yet labor men will tell you, and they know of what they speak, that there is no room for any great number of fresh arrivals.

The solutions lie in the land; in new mining development and in the fishing industry, so

far as British Columbia is concerned. With the land, lumbering should be included, for a boom in lumbering throughout the province is certain to come with the rebuilding of Belgium and Northern France. So far as farming land is concerned, the government must carefully consider and adopt measures for the bringing under cultivation of the hundreds of thousands of acres of good land which are tied up for speculative purposes. A heavy tax on unimproved land, making it unprofitable to hold land for speculative purposes seems the easiest plan, but that can safely be left to our new administrators. Once it is regained for the people, the land must be settled upon a carefully planned community system so that the farmers have all the advantages of town life in the way of schools, churches etc.

Room can be made for thousands more in the fishing industry by the ousting of the Oriental, who has controlled the labor end of this business many years too long. With the cannery monopoly broken, there will be more canneries and a greater demand for labor. With the boat rating gone, the independent white fishermen will get prices for their salmon which will enable them to purchase boats for other lines of fishing, such as halibut, thus building up a Canadian fleet of halibut boats.

In mining, lies the greatest hope of this district, and, with encouragement given to the small miner and less power given to the big corporations, there should be a big re-awakening in this industry with the results that there will be enough ore produced to warrant a smelter and probably a refinery in this vicinity.

The most important point is that, for the present, the cities of this province do not require men. Our cities will grow, and grow rapidly, but that growth must be produced from the

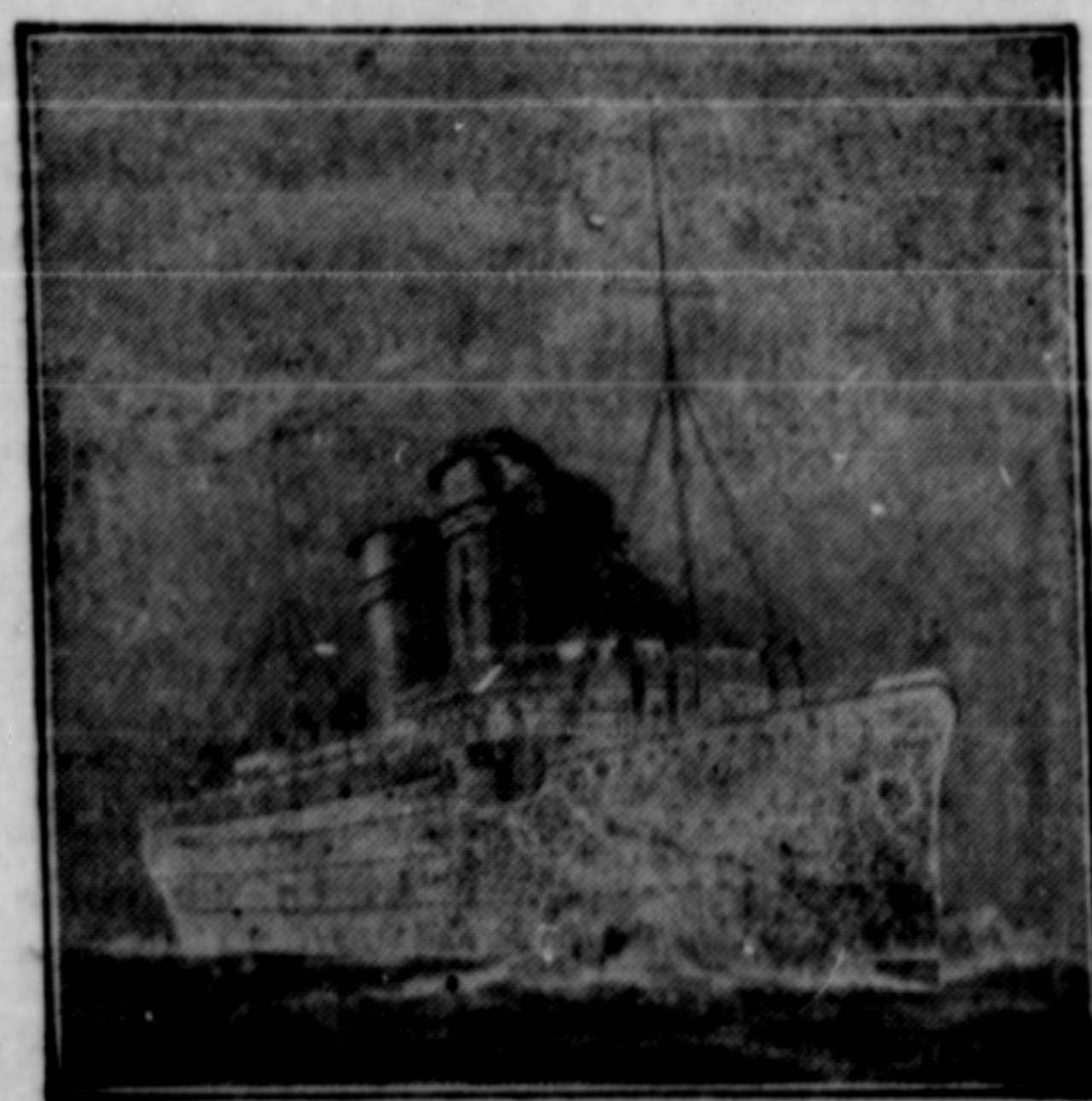
