## NOTES AND COMMENTS

The Journal tries to make capital for Bowser out of a certain most regrettable incident in the history of Prince Rupert, but it does not mention where William Manson disappeared to on that historic occasion. William was 'posted as missing' around that date. As usual, he dodged the issue.

The Journal has a well regulated memory, which forgets conveniently. Just as Bowser forgot that he was a director of the Wallace Shipyards, which company obtained favors from the government, the local Bowser organ forgets that on the occasion of the battle, William Manson called up H. M. S. Rainbow.

On a more recent occasion, Bowser ordered out the troops to hold their guns over the Nainimo miners, and, as a result of that Mackenzie-Mann episode, the mines are now employing many Chinese. Chinese are more docile than Scotch and Welsh miners who are apt to stand up on their feet like men and demand their rights, and docility is what Bowser most admires (in others), hence his liking for the Hon. William Manson.

William is so docile that he did not attempt to raise his voice for Prince Rupert in the Executive Council when Point Grey was given what Prince Rupert has been asking for for years.

All that is necessary to convince one that Bowser is beaten, and knows that he is beaten, is to read his speeches. They are not the speeches of a premier but of a crude machine politician who has been found out.

which he paid not one cent. All along the line, he showed that the company got double prices for

everything, as for instance, 8c. per pound for iron, bolts, etc., besides \$1.00 per ton per mile for hauling. That was where the people's money had gone and that was why there was a continual demand for more, and if Bowser were returned to power it would be given. He advocated the calling for tenders for such railroad work instead of allowing the company to let the contract to themselves at their own prices. In concluding a very able speech, Mr. Lynch called upon the electors to put this government out of business and to send T. D. Pattullo to Victoria.

## T. D. Pattullo.

On rising to speak, T. D. Pattullo was given a rousing reception. At the outset he called upon all present to vote for Woman Suffrage. He believed that by giving the women the vote we would get better and cleaner government, and certainly the women could not do worse than the men had done in the past few years. The Liberals had always supported the principle and, if the men refused the franchise he would still favor the granting of it.

He intimated that a telegram had been received stating that the clause in the United States Revenue Bill dealing with the Prince Rupert fish trade had been left out and that the halibut industry would still be ours. (Great cheers).

In regard to fishing, he was strongly in favor of doing everything possible to foster the up-building of a fleet of Canadian bottoms sailing out of Prince Rupert. In salmon fishing, he would not be satisfied until the monopoly had been broken and the Oriental put out. On a recent visit down the coast, he thought he had landed in Chinatown, there were so many Orientals. He strongly favored the exclusion of the Orientals.

## Public Utilities.

He said that, as William Manson had raised the question of his attitude on public utilities, he would deal with his opponent's statements. He read an

extract from The Journal of Aug. 27th in which Mr. Manson was reported to have intimated that he had tried to grab a telephone franchise for this city.

Dealing first with the water supply, he pointed out that, before the city was incorporated, C. M. member of the government which allowed Mr. Woodworth to stake the water, and William Manson, as mayor, had the city pay Mr. Woodworth \$15,000 for the rights.

In regard to the telephone franchise, he pointed out that before the city was incorporated, several companies wanted to get a telephone franchise and he thought that it should be retained in the city, so he offered to put up the money to secure it. The matter was brought before the Board of Trade and it was thought that \$10,000 would handle the transaction and the members offered to put it through. He put up \$500 along with some others and in a few minutes they had the \$10,000. \$5,000 more was needed and he put up \$750. William Manson did not put up a cent, though he now found fault with the men who did. Had this not been done, the franchise would have gone to an outsider.

Mr. Pattullo then read from an editorial of The Journal of Dec. 24th, 1912, which stated that a number of citizens, including T. D. Pattullo saved the telephone franchise for the city by putting up their own money, and they did not get a cent of interest from the city for the use of it. "Now you know that the Journal is reliable," said the speaker amidst laughter.

His stand on the hydro-electric was well known to all. He had placed the matter before the people and had expressed his opinion, as a man should. The city engineer reported favorably on the transaction and the company had no control of the city, as their lines stopped at the city gates. Had the company come in, they would have brought in outside capital and would have brought in business, which was badly needed, without interfering with ultimate municipal ownership. What did William Manson do? He was a party to the granting of the franchise to the company which gave it the power to put

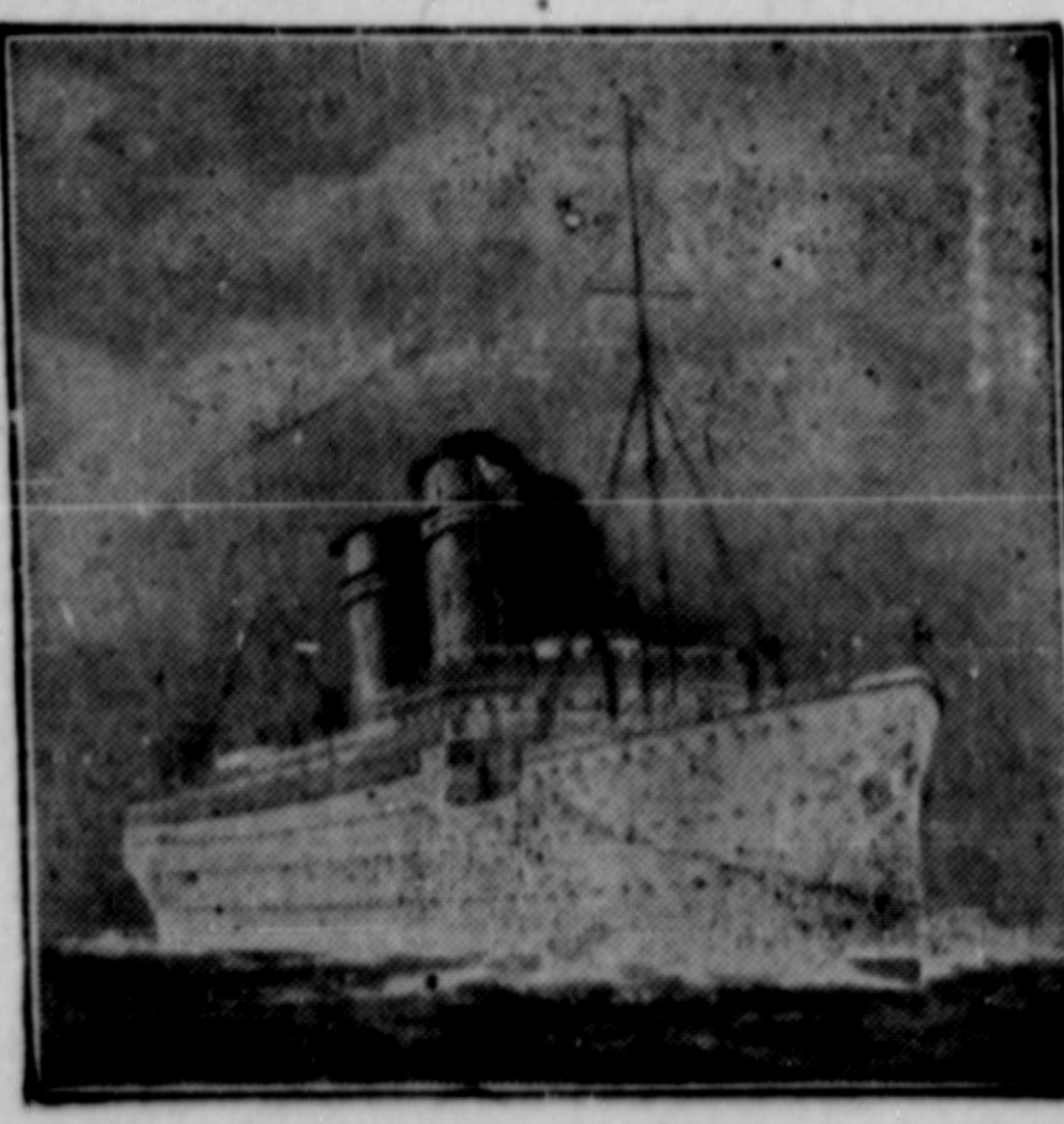
